Norway's literary tradition spans centuries, from the poems and sagas of the Viking Age to the explosion of the romantic era, to 20th century Nobel Prize winners to the hugely popular crime literature of today and beyond. The vast corpus of Norwegian literature documents the country's complex progression through time. Along with the works of native-born Norwegian writers, we can also include those Norwegians who left Norway for the New World and their descendants in the US and Canada. As times have changed in Norway, literature has borne witness to – and at times influenced – this unique, dynamic people.
